SCHEMAS

There is a fancy word for those urges that children feel to climb, throw things, and hide in small places; schema! Clare Caro found many similarities to Maria Montessori's known sensitive periods and shared them with early childhood communities.

Some stay around for a long time and some pass so quickly they are barely detected. They are building blocks for the brain, forging connections and unfolding patterns, learning, and growth.

Knowing about these urges can help us better understand why children are so determined to complete actions at developmental stages.

Have you experienced these ten?

1. Orientation
The urge to hang upside-down.
2. Positioning
The urge to place items in a line.
3. Connection
The urge to click pieces together.
4. Trajectory
The urge to throw and drop items.
5. Enclosure
The urge to climb in boxes.
6. Container
The urge to fill cups with water.
7. Transporting
The urge to carry many things.
8. Enveloping
The urge to wrap things in cloth.
9. Rotation
The urge to spin round and round.
10. Transformation
The urge to create a new product.
